Soup—We will have a variety of soups.


And you are invited to bring something to go with soup, Pot-luck style: bread, crackers, salad, dessert, etc.

The Property Team, with assistance from lots of folks, took in \$2600 in fundraising from Garlic Fest parking. The team is reviewing the needs of our church building and how we can pay for needed repairs. They welcome new members to the team.

The Mission Team is continuing its work on local missions such as the Blessing Box, Safe Harbor dinners, in partnership with Trinity Episcopal, monthly church lunches and more. With the help of a free trial program from Outreach Digital, the same company that handles our "New Mover" postcards, we are posting on social media at least once a day. 
